


ABOUT US

CLINICAL SERVICES

Health Screening

Our clinic offers a variety of services including blood pressure monitoring, head lice checks, lead level testing, smoking prevention with cessation education, and referrals.

Family Planning

Reproductive health visits, counseling, education, and birth control methods for women, men, and teens. Permanent sterilization consultation, pregnancy testing, counseling, and assistance with referrals to Medicaid for pregnancy. Emergency contraception, women's health screening (pap smears and referrals for other services based on age and/or need). Services are provided at a reduced or no cost rate based on the income of the patient.

Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening

Women's Health screening to provide early detection, screening, and referral services for breast and cervical cancers (pap smears and referrals for mammograms and other services based on age and/or need). Services are provided at a reduced or no cost rate based on the income of the patient and is provided to uninsured/underinsured WV residents.

Immunizations/Vaccines

Childhood and adult vaccines administered according to school requirements and CDC recommendations. Childhood vaccines are available through the Vaccines for Children Program for uninsured/underinsured clients with a reduced vaccine administration fee.

Foreign Travel Immunizations

Vaccines required and recommended for travel are available following a travel consultation with our physician. Travel vaccines and consultations are an out-of-pocket expense to each individual.

Tuberculosis

Our clinic staff detects, diagnoses, and treats all cases of tuberculosis and suspected cases not under private medical supervision. Services include appropriate laboratory testing, x-ray, monitoring by our state physician, and medication administration. Tuberculosis screening is available as required for school admission and/or employment qualification.

Sexually Transmitted Infection

We provide comprehensive education, resources, and counseling to individuals and the community to reduce the rate of sexually transmitted infections. We provide consultation, appropriate laboratory testing, and treatment to all persons regardless of income or insurance.

Confidential HIV Testing

Providing anonymous and confidential HIV testing, HIV education, and linkage to care as needed. Offering PrEP (Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis) services for HIV-negative individuals.

Quick Response Team (QRT)

We engage with the community to raise awareness about substance use in a non-judgmental and stigma free environment. Naloxone training is available for community members, equipping them with the knowledge and tools to respond effectively in the event of an opioid overdose. Our team provides peer support and referrals to addiction treatment for those that want a happier, healthier tomorrow. Our staff reaches out to survivors of opioid overdose and offers them assistance with support and treatment options. Our goal is to address substance use disorder needs and to ignite a culture of active recovery, instilling hope, and resilience in every corner of out community.

Epidemiology & Communicable Disease

We identify, assess, and investigate individual cases as well as outbreaks of communicable diseases. We provide education to providers and the community regarding the presence and spread of reportable communicable diseases through integrated efforts with local medical care providers and facilities.



ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

The Environmental Health Division protects public health by helping to ensure a safe and healthy environment. Our staff permits and inspects restaurants, food trucks, hotels, motels, B&Bs, short-term rentals, child care centers, public swimming pools, campgrounds, body art studios, manufactured home communities, and more. Environmental health staff also evaluate sites and soils in order to issue permits for individual wells and septic systems. We also investigate complaints related to our permitted establishments and nuisance complaints.



Public health emergency preparedness involves planning and implementing programs to rapidly detect, investigate and control a number of threats that may endanger the health of the public. These threats include emerging infectious diseases, disease outbreaks, pandemics, chemical or radiological exposures, and bioterrorism. Jefferson County Health Department works with medical and emergency response partners at the local, state, and federal level to ensure the most effective response to public health threats.



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
